WILLIAM CUTTRISS (1852-1953)

William Cuttriss was born in England at Haddenham, Cambridgeshire, on 4 December 1852. He was named for his father who was a shoemaker. His mother was Alice nee Newman. He came to Australia via New Zealand however I have not found his entry into the country. His sister, Sarah may have travelled with him. From his death certificate the time spent in NSW suggests that he may have arrived about 1878.

The first official record relating to William in Australia, is when he married Johanna Heinecke at St Matthew's Church of England at Albury on 14 December 1889. Johanna is said to have been born in Gundagai on 17 June 1865 to Charles and Mary J Heinecke (although this date has not been found on the registers) and on her marriage her residence was given as Melbourne, Victoria. Her mother, Mary nee Byrne was originally from Ireland and it is believed that Charles was from Germany.

By 1891 the Cuttriss family had moved to the Southern Highlands, probably to the town of Mittagong, where their first child, Frederick William was born although his birth was registered at Bowral. The next year Alice Newman was born, and also registered in Bowral. Henrietta, the next daughter was registered in Mittagong in 1894 with the address given as Station Street. The next three daughters, were all registered as at Argyle Street, Picton. This was over the period 1896-1906. According to William's obituary, the family also lived in Kempsey so perhaps they moved from Picton to Kempsey prior to their move to Port Macquarie.

It was in 1907 that the family came to Port Macquarie and established a drapery business in Horton Street. The shop was located on the eastern side where the National Bank now stands and the business was in operation until the 1970s. In the early years they lived in a terrace almost opposite in Horton Street, where Susans is now.

William was actively involved in the running of his business until he retired at the age of ninety around 1943. He had been ably assisted through the years by his second daughter, Henrietta. Ettie, as she was known, never married, and carried on the business until illness overtook her in 1947 when she had to cease work. She predeceased her parents, dying in January 1949.

William reached the age of 100 but he died 7 months later, in July of 1953. His obituary in Port Macquarie News, 9.7.1953 carries a photograph of him and describes him as being well read and relished talking to people reliving his own experiences in his early days in Australia. He was also had severe deafness probably in the later years. At the time of his death, they were living at "Argyle", William Street. Johanna did not survive her husband for very long. She died in the same year, in October at the age of 89. They are both buried in Port Macquarie Cemetery.

William and Johanna had three children who predeceased them. The first child to die was their only son, Frederick. Fred had been educated in Picton and had then gone to Sydney and was employed by Nettleton, Son & Co., a wholesale furniture and bedding company in Kent Street. He lived at the YMCA. He enjoyed sport and was involved in all the sports available at or through the YMCA. He was in Sydney when war was declared and he enlisted on 16 February 1915. He joined the 18th Battalion

and his contingent sailed from Sydney on the HMAT A40 "Ceramic" on 25 June 1915. After further training in Egypt, the battalion was landed at Gallipoli. The landing took place on a Sunday and after resting the whole day, they then marched for a day and a night to Hill 60 which the 18th Battalion had to hold without any other assistance as the British troops did not arrive in time. They were in an impossible situation and consequently they were practically annihilated with only 20 answering the roll next day. It was on this day, 22nd August 1915, that Fred was reported missing in action. It was not until 1916 that it was considered reasonable to assume his death. One can only imagine how devastating this would have been on the family. Because there was no recorded burial he is commemorated on the Australian Lone Pine Memorial at Gallipoli.

Alice was the eldest daughter and she married a clerk, Edwin Witt of Macksville at St Thomas Church, Port Macquarie on 7.5.1919. Her occupation was given as milliner. She was widowed by 1934 when she married George "Joe" Jarrett, a liveryman, on 11.4.1934 in Sydney and lived in Bellingen. Her married name has been recorded as Janet, Jarret or Garret however Jarrett is correct. Her second husband died in August 1947 at Bellingen at the age of 52. Alice did not survive him very long. Her death occurred here in Port Macquarie on January 2nd 1948 and is most likely buried with her husband at Bellingen. The Jarretts had no children.

The third daughter was Ada Myee (Maree) and she married Sydney Winter at Concord in 1924.

The next two daughters married local men:

Edith wed Harry (Henry Thomas) McLaren, in October 1923 and they had two daughters, Shirley and Norma. Harry McLaren was born about 1897 and was an oyster farmer. His parents were both from old identity families of the Hastings. His father was Daniel McLaren and his mother was originally Lizzie Dick. Edith died in March 1975 and Harry died in 1993, aged 96, and they are buried in the Church of England section of the Port Macquarie Cemetery.

The McLaren girls also married local men. Shirley married Cecil Radley, born in Moorelands in 1931. Her sister married a McMullen.

Ellen Rita married William Warlters, another very old and well respected local family. They married in 1932 and lived at Rolland's Plains. By 1953 they had moved to West Port Macquarie and were living in Bridge Street. As at March 2001, Ellen is still alive and living in the Garden Village Hostel.

CENTENARIAN PASSES

Mr. W. CUTTRISS

Port Macquarie's oldest living resident, Mr. William Cuttriss, died at his home in William Street on Sunday last, at the grand old age of 100 years and seven months.

Deceased was a native of Haddenham, England, and came to Australia, via New Zealand when quite a young man.

Ten years ago when the above photograph was taken in front of his shop, Mr. Cuttriss was a familiar figure in Horton Street.

The late Mr. Cuttriss first came to Port Macquarie in 1907, and during his 46 years here he had the esteem and respect of his fellow citizens not only for his integrity but for his square dealing in business. He opened a drapery business in Horton Street in 1907, and it is still carried on by descendants of the family to-day. Deceased had turned ninety years of age before he ceased to take an active part in the running of the business.

MRS. J. CUTTRISS

The death occurred on Saturday night last, October 17th, of Mrs. Johanna Cuttriss, of William Street, Port Macquarie, at the age of 89 years.

The deceased was the relict of the late William Cuttriss, who died in July at the age of 100 years. The late Mrs. Cuttriss was born at Gundagai and married to her late husband at Albury.

Since 1907 she had lived at Port Macquarie.

Of a family of five daughters and one son, three daughters survive: Mrs. Winter (Sydney), Mrs. H. T. McLaren and Mrs. Wm. Warlters (Port Macquarie).

Mrs. Janet (Alice), Miss H. Cuttriss, and Mr. Fred Cuttriss (killed on Gallipoli) predeceased their parents.

Remarkably independent, the late Mrs. Cuttriss was endowed with a strong spirit, which enabled her to bear life's worries easily.

The interment, beside her husband, was made on Sunday, in the Church of England portion of Port Macquarie cemetery.

Though handicapped by a severe deafness, the late Mr. Cuttriss was one of the most entertaining and well read talkers one could wish to listen to, and he relished telling tales of his own experiences in his early days in this country.

Before coming to Port Macquarie, the late Mr. Cuttriss had lived at Mittagong, Picton and Kempsey.

Sixty-three years ago, at St. Matthews' Church of England, Albury, deceased married Mrs. Cuttriss, who survives him. Of their six children, the son, Fred, was killed on Gallipoli, in August, 1915. Two daughters are deceased, viz., Alice (Mrs. Jarrett, of Bellingen), and Miss Ettie Cuttriss, who was in the drapery business with her father for many years.

Mrs. Winter (Concord), Mrs. Harry McLaren and Mrs. Wm. Warlters (West Port Mac-

quarie) are daughters. A number of grandchildren and great grand-children also survive.

The funeral, at 3 p.m. on Monday afternoon, moved from the Church of St. Thomas, and the interment was made in the Church of England portion of the cemetery.

The late Miss Cuttriss had been an obliging and popular business-woman in Port Macquarie for many years, and it was with profound regret that it was learned two years ago she was seriously ill, and her active business life had to cease. She was a patient sufferer as mother and sisters nursed her through her ever-shortening days on this earth.

Born at Mittagong, the late Miss Cuttriss came to Port Macquarie with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. Cuttriss, about forty years ago. For many years she was associated with her father in the well-known drapery business in Horton Street, and she carried the business on after her father's retirement some few years ago.

As a business associate, the late Miss Cuttriss was well known and respected, as is her father.

Besides her sorrowing parents, the late Miss Cuttriss leaves three sisters to mourn her loss, viz., Ada (Mrs. Winter, Concord), Edie (Mrs. H. T. McLaren, West Port Macquarie), and Ellen (Mrs. W. Warlters, Rolland's Plains. Another sister, Alice (Mrs. Garrett, of Bellingen), died at Port Macquarie, in 1947, when 55 years of age.

The funeral on Thursday, left the Church of St. Thomas, where a service was held, and the interment took place in the Church of England portion of Port Macquarie cemetery, Archdeacon T. M. Gerry officiating. William McWhirter conducted the funeral arrangements.

The Cuttriss family will have the heart felt sympathy of one and all.

Private FREDERICK WILLIAM CUTTRISS.

Private Frederick William Cuttriss (1143), born at Mittagong, and educated at Picton, is the son of William and Johanna Cuttriss, of Horton-street, Port Macquarie. He is 27 years of age, and enlisted in Sydney on 13th March, 1915. He landed at Gallipoli on a Sunday, and after resting the whole day marched to Hill 60, which occupied a day and a night. As the English troops did not arrive in time, the 18th Battalion had to hold the hill by themselves, which was impossible to do, and consequently they were practically annihilated, only about 20 answering the roll next day. It was on this day, 22nd August, that he was reported killed. Prior to his enlistment, he was employed by Nettleton, Son & Co., Sydney, and resided at the Y.M.C.A. in that city. He joined in all the sports of the Y.M.C.A., of which he was an esteemed member.

His contingent sailed from Sydney in July of that year and after further training in Egypt were thrust into the battle at Gallipoli where Frederick was killed in action on August 22, 1915.
