## Obituary. <br> PM.N SAT. - 7.4.1917 Mr. JOSIAH SECOMBE.

At the advainced age of 34 years, Mr. Jusiah Secombe, of Eunis, on Thursday, March 15th, olosed a long and useful life, the greater portion of which had been spent in this district. As a lad of 17 years, hé, with his two elder brothers, with their wives and families, emigrated from Cornwall (England), and landed in this district in 1850, and immediately entered upon farming pursuts at Rollands Plains. The two elder brothers subsequently removed to Dondingalong, in the Macleay district, where they established comfortable homes, reared large families, and made for themselves an honored name, whioh is to-day worthily tipheld by their , descendants. Josiah having married Catherine, second daughter of the late Mr. John McDonnough, of Rawdon Villa, resided for several years on the property of the late Mr. John Pountney, known as " Scott's Plains," but on the enactment of what is popularly known as the "Free Selection Land Act," Mr. Secombe torok up a valuable portion of land at Ennis, all of which locality was at that time standing sernb, so that it frequired the expenditure of a vast amount of labour, amidst many incidental difficulties, in order to establish a home and make a living, but the exercise of perse vering industry brought its reward. To Mr. and Mrs. Secombe were born three childrefi, viz., one daughter (Mrs. W. Fryer, of Sydney), and two sons-Patrick Henry, of Ennis, and Josiah. of Sydney. Mr. and Mrs. Secombe's home was a centre of hospitality in carly days, when facilities for accommodation were few and far between. Any genuine or deserving appeal for help never fuiled of asmiatance at their hands. Mr. Necombe also took a deep and practical interest in any project to advance the welfare of the district. He was a prominent member and staunch adherent of the Methodist Church, occupying several important positions of trust in that church, the duties of which he discharged to the best of his ability and conscientiously, and was held in highesteem by all who came in contact with him for his honest integrity. Mrs. Secombe predeceas. ed her hushand upwards of twenty years ago, and Mr. Secombe subsequently married Miss Martha Lynn, of the Macleny River and to them was born one son, Jolin Lym, who, with his mother and the children of the first marriage, now survive the hushand and father. Mr. Secombe possessed the old-time English physical constitution, hence until quite recently never required medical attention, but the weight of advancing years ultimately induced retirement, and the lass few months brought prostration such as required constant wateh. ing and mursing, which were lovingly rendered by his devout wife and smen, until the end came quietly and peacefully on the afternoon of the date mentioned. The funeral towk place on the 16th, when the mady was haid to rest in the Methodist purtion of the Beechwood cemetery in the presenee of a large assembly of relatives and friends from all parte of the district, inclading several nephews from the Macleay. Mr. R. Daridsom, in the unavoidable whence of the Rev.: A. E. P'uthand, conducted the service at the graveside, and in the course of a concise address bore personal testimony to the useful and honorable life of the departed during his long sojourn in the Hastings distriet. The funeral arrangements were barried out by Mr. H. T. Wilkins.

ADA ROSANNA SECOMB <br> The death occurred on Saturday at Wauchope Memorial Hospital of Mrs. Ada Rosanna Secomb, aged 91 years, or Beechwood. <br> Mrs. Secombe was born to the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Halliday, farming people in Port Macquarie, and married William Percy Secomb at Rollands Plains. <br> Mr. Secomb died in 1963. <br> Mrs. Secomb is survived by two daughters, one of whom, Ena Florence (Mrs. Thompson) lives at Beechwood. <br> After a service at 2.30 p.m., on Sunday, July 18, the funeral left Wauchope Methodist Wauchope cemetery.

Elbe deoeased drank the medioine, and aftors wards rinsed his mouth with the aoid. He at onee: complained, and a dootor was ment for, but Mr. Secombe was dend on bia arrival.

Dr. Kane stated that on his arrival to gave docensed antidotes, but without availo Docencod died from carbolic poiconing, 0 toespoonful of which would be fatal

A verdiot of acoidentel death was rotimened. The late Mr. "Rey" Secombe was well tithwn on the Macleay and Hatiinge Rivoss. He revided with his parents on the Uppor Yecleay for a couplo of years, and has cibice vicited the districts in oonnoction with the sale of pacpalam ereed. The young man served with diatinetion in Soath Afrise, where he was wounded, and walked lame is consequence.

Tuesday, 8th December, recos'ds the passing of one of the district's aged and useful identities in the person of Mr. P. H. Secombe.

Born over 90 years ago at Ennis, he was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Josiah Secombe, "Pať" (as he was familiarly known,) lived in the Ennis locality for the first 40 years of his long life.

Seeking better health, he shifted to higher ground known as the Redbank Estate; here he continued dairy farming with unabated interest, enjoying much improved health.

From this locality, ine exerted a keen interest in puolic affairs, including Local Government, being at one time a member of the Hastings Shire Council. The annual agricultural and horticultural exhibition at Wauchope claimed his generous assistance, and he took a keen interest in P. \& C. affairs, the Junior Farmers Movement, whilst in a wider sphere be was a foundation identity in connection with the immigration projects operating afte: he two world wars-his home was ever open to newcomers from other lands.

When the time of retirement came his way. the late Mr. Secombe continued his public interests from his Wauchope home where he took up residence 27 years ago.

Right from early maniacud, he acknowledged the Sovereignty of God, and took an active and keen interest in the Church to which the belonged, and in later life took more interest in the artivities of the British and Foreign Bible Society which he supported from his chair at home.

Other interests spread over Mr. Secombe's life included Wauchope's original butter factory, then situated on the property known as Cainstin's Park (overlooking Rocks Ferry). He was for a tirne manager of this establishment and when the activities of such came to a halt, he became a director of the new concern built in Port Macquarie which for a time handled the Hastings butter production.

He also journeyed per horse buggy to the monthly meetings of the Hastings District Hospital Committee in Port Macquarie.

When, in the course of time the butter production management at Port changed hands, Mr. Secombe transferred his interest to Wingham where a bacon factory inad been built to protect the local pig raisers from fluctuating prices. He was a sitterg director of the Company up to the time of his passing.

He was a keen lover of horses, and up to within three years of his dernfe nothing pleased him more than to be astride a good animal with a herd of cattle in front.

Three months ago, declining strength compelled this active life to stay within doors, where inactivity seemed to hasten the end which took place during the eariy hours of Tuesday, 8th December.

His partner in life predeceased him by 18 years, but to mourn their loss he leaves a family of six, viz., Ella (Mrs G. Garrett, Wauchope), Gordon (Kempsey), Miss Clarice Hastings Secombe (Wauchope), Milton Bruce (RuthvenHill. Wauchope; Sidney Wilfred ("Jack," of Redbank Wauchope), Adele (Mrs. Dean of Tawnsville, Queens!and). A half-brother, Mr . John L . Secombe, lives in Sydney. There are also 3.8 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchild ren.
The Rev. Chas. Wheeler performed the last sad rites at the graveside, after a short service in Wauchope Methodist Church, the large funeral and bounteous floral tributes bearing witness to the esteem in whicn the deceased was held bv a wide circle of Hasting's district residents.-"Shire" Gazette.

The parents of Clarice and Bruce married at Sandy Point on 22nd October, 1885, the ceremony conducted by Rev. John Davis. The witnesses to the marriage of Patrick H Secombe and Cordelia Sidon (nee Andrews) were Walter Fryer and Nancy Andrews.
The children of Pat and Delie Secombe were Ella, Fordon, Clarice, Bruce, S. W (Jack) and Adele (Dell). Another daughter deceased.
For many years the family's housekeeper was Miss Alice Knight. Her mother was midwife to the Secombe children with the exception of Bruce who was delivered by Mrs Bill Bailey.

Bruce and Clarice said: *After their marriage the famill occupied a home at Sandy Point. Some time later a new home was built on the hill it was called 'Elliston'
"Elliston was built for us by Mr... Andrew (Andy) Johnston. ${ }^{\text {. }}$

Clarice: "Elliston was built to honour Uncle Eddy Ellis He was Aunty Em's husband
Bruce: "He put Papa (P. H. Secombe) into the position of being able to purchase the land at Redbank.'
Mr. E. Ellis married Emily Andrews. She was a sister of Jane who married Duncan Eraham of Koree Island and of Elizabeth (Bessie) Andrew. who resides in Rocks Ferry Road. Emily's husband managed the Bank of New South Wales in Port Macquarie. Mr. Isaac Andrews, the father of Mrs P. H. Secombe, occupied Ruthven Hill at that time. R. Y.

Bruce: " A good many years later Vivienne (the wife of Jack Secombe) changed the name to Meadowbank.

Clarice and Bruce, speaking about Ennis: "The Good Termpars Hall was behind Nancy Robinson's place. Other farms were those of Fallick, Denning, Roach, Lord Cowrie, Egger and W. J. Andrews was at Sandy Point then.'

Bruce: " 1 was there when Doug Andrews stood up - after crawling."

Doug's father, W. J. Andrews was the only son of Isaac Andrews of Ruthven Hill. R. Y.

Bruce: "When the Secombe girls were of school age they used to walk down the river
bank to where they were rowed across the river to Daniher's who lived on the Wauchope side. Mr. J. N. parker pulled the school boat for twopence (2d) a head from where the Rocks ferry is now to the Government wharf."
Clarice and Bruce: "Freeman's shop was there and next door was Brophy's place. Mr. Walter Fryer bought Freemans. His daughter Velvie, until she was 7 or 8 years old, had Mrs Melville as her governess. When she was older Velvie suffered a broken jaw and used o always wear a big veil over her face."

Bruce: "I can still remember buying bull's eyes from Freeman's shop."
Clarice: "Our grandfather (Josiah Secombe). lived at Rollands Plains before he came to live at Ennis. He built a large barn just about opposite his house."

Bruce and Clarice: "The Ennis Wharf was just opposite the Muscio farm. After a big flood some old coins were found in the cane patch on Muscio's property.
The Wesleyan Church used to be where the Jacaranda trees are now. It stood there for many years and then Mr. Err Trotter bought it and moved it to Beechwood. Mrs Alex Trotter (nee Way) lives there now.'

Bruce: "I remember the timber boats collecting timber from Corecarra Creek what - it was a tidal creek.

Clarice and Bruce: "The Anglican Church at Ennis was built near Mr. Sam Steel's barn.

The old Dawes home still stands near the Steel farm Their house was built about the time Fred dawes got marsied. It had a floor of beech wood -tongue and groove - and the boards came from the old Fryer home.

Sandy Point is the land which was lies left from the corner at Ennis. Our father pourchased Ruthven Hill from our Uncle, Arthur Bartrim (he married Nancy Andrews). There was a beautiful garden and orchard - oranges, gauvas, persimmons, peaches, pears, lots of fruit and near the creek there were poplars along the fence.

The Ennis ferry was near the old Dawes house. Miss the old Dawes house. Miss
Nellie Dawes was born in that
house. The Dawes family later moved over to Frank Warlters farm and then eventually they moved in retirement to Port Macquarie. ${ }^{\text {. }}$
Bruce: "I went to Sabbath School at the Ennis Wesleyan Church."
In 1976 there were framed certificates on the wall of Bruce's home at Ruthven Hill stating: In recognition and grateful appreciation of his completion of 25 years of will ing and devoted service remdered to the church as a local preacher. The certificate was signed at Port macquarie in 1957 and the second certificate was presented for 50 years of service to the church and signed in 1971. R. Y.
Bruce: "The windows and linings and the boiler from the Ennis bacon factory were noved to the Ennis wharf by a bullock team. The posts and roof of an out-building were from the old Port Macquarie gaol, the planks were of allowood. They were tongue and grooved 14 feet long, over an inch thick and 8 inches wide. This was al Ruthven House.
I can still recall the sailing boats on the river and how the vessels would be poled up the river.
Clarice: "Papa bought the Fallick farm and the house was moved to Wauchope for wis to live in when we left Elliston.
Bruce: "The house was on the hill near the Denning's place. Phil Fallick's father was a member of Parliament -Phil married Mi Dolly Suters. The house was moved to the back of where the Wauchope Hospital is. it was removed by Mr. Tom Bartlett, his wife was a sister of Mrs Phil Fallick.

The Fallick farm was 396 acres and was on both sides of the Redbank Road. The house was built where the trees are now at Roger Secombe's place.
Bruce: - Ruthven Hill home, built in 1870, was roof ed with oak shingles until about 1925-26 when they were replaced by a corrugated iron roof. The original convict well was 10 foot square, built on a rock base and the water came in from a spring fresh and clear.

Miss Clarice Secombe, after the death of her parents, live in a cottage situated at the $1 / / 4$ of the house she had lived it with her parents and with her sister Dell (the house removed from the Fallick farm).
Several old trees, including lemon and persimmon still grow in the spacious grounds of the cottage built by vincent Unicomb of Port Macquarie for Clarice.

"This large congregation representative of all sections of the community is indicative of the esteem and high regard in which she was neld by the townspeople of Taree and Distriot.
"An active member of the Taree Methodis Church she is revered by many who were privileged to share with her in the joy and gladness of Christian Fellowship.
"We are the poorer for her passing and mourn the loss of a loving and beloved wife,- a mother, a daughter, a sister and friend.
"Evelyn Kerr brought to her marriage true Christian grace and proved over the years her loyalty and allegiance to her vows. In the love, honor and comfort which she gladly rendered she proved herself a wonderful helpmate.
"As a mother she brought to this high vocation a sense of dedication and gave to her sons both high ideals and practical insights.
"She gave to her parents obedience, love and loyalty and was a wonderful companion to her sisters, whose ministrations helped and streng, thened her in her long and difficult illness.
"As a member of one of Taree's oldest families she was justifiably proud of that heritage and possessed in a great degree the spirit of the pioneer forbears who first settled this part of the Manning.
"With wise insight she sensed the historical importance of the Glenthonne Methodist Church where the first Methodist services were held over a century ago and when it looked as if the church would be closed she gave herself, although ill in body, to seeing that its doors remained open.
"The community found in Evelyn Kerr a woman of wide and varied interests and there were few charitable and philanthropic causes which did not receive her ardent

"I would also like to pay tribute to the love and devotion of the famy over many months and especially to Bert Kerr, whose first thought was always for his wife's comfort and well being.

"This is a sad occasion but it is not only a time for sorrow. Christianity is never so confident, it is never so exultant as in its proclamation of life in God.
"Alive to all true values Evelyn Kerr is now alive to God beyond the vale of suffering."

Another of the pioneers of the district in the person of Mr . Josiah Secomb, of Ennis, passed away in the afternoon of Thursday last, at the ripe old age of 84 years, the cause of death being senile decay. Mr. Secomb was a native of Cornwall, England, and he with two elder brothers, John and Edward, came to the district in 1850 and proceeded to Rolland's Plains, where they engaged in farming pursuits for several years. Eventually the two elder brothers pushed on to the Macleay River, where many of their descendants still live, upholding the traditions of an honored name. Mr. Secomb was married twice, his first wife (who died over 20 years ago) being a daughter of Mr. McDonough, of Rawdon Villa, through which union there were one daughter (Mrs. W. Fryer (Sydney), and two sons, Patrick Henry (Ennis), and Josiah (Sydney). By his second marriage to the daughter of John Lymn, one son was born, Mr. John Lynn, and these two survive. Mr. Secomb was a prominent member of the Methodist Church, and was held in high esteem by those who knew him. His closing days were marked by weakness and the end came peacefully. ## A century for Clarice



Among the people at Bundaleer on Friday to help Miss Clarice Secombe celebrate her 100th birthday was Mrs Linda Judd of Kempsey who is a niece to Clarice. Linda obliged when it was time to cut the special birthday cake by assisting her Aunt dispense with the official duty. The morning tea celebrations were enjoyed by all who called in to Bundaleer to be part of Clarice's special day.

## Clarice reaches 100 Birthday celebration at Bundaleer tomorrow

With the celebration of the 100th birthday of Miss Clarice Secombe tomorrow (January 17) and all the changes she has seen in her lifetime, we look back to the first Secombe who came to the Hastings.

We obtained this information from the Port Mac quarie News of April 17, 1917.

Josiah Secombe came to the Hastings at the age of 17 years.
He , with his two brothers, their wives and families emigrated from Cornwall, England and landed in this district in 1850, and immediately entered upon farming pursuits at Rollands Plains.
The two elder brothers subsequently removed to Dondingalong, in the established comfortable homes, reared large families, and made for themselves an honoured name which is today worthily upheld by their descendants.
Josiah, having married Catherine McDonough, second daughter of Mr John McDonough Rawdon Villa, resided for evty of the late Mr. Po:ntney, and known as Scott's Plains, but on the enactment of what is popuarly known as the Free Sel ection Land Act, Mr. Secombe took up a valuable portion of land at Ennis, all of which locality was at that time standing scrub, so that it required the expenditure of a vast moun of labour, amidst in order to establish a hom and make a living but the exercise of perservering industry brought its reward
Mr and Mrs Secombe's home was a centre of hospitality in early days when facilites for accomodation were few and far between appeal for help never failed fassistance at their hands.
Mr. Secombe also took deep and practical interest a deep and practical interest the welfare of the district. He was a prominent member and staunch supporter of the Methodist Church, occupying several important positions of trust in that church, the duties of which he discharged to the best of his ability and conscien-

tiously.
He was held in high esteem by all who came in contact with him for his onest integrity.
To Mr and Mrs Secombe were bom three children, Fryer of Sydney) (Mrs W Fons, Patrick Henry of Ens, Patrick Henry of ney)."
Josiah passed away in 1917 and his wife Catherine in 1897.
Both are buried
Beechwood cemetery.
From the notes supplied by Mr. Owen Secombe, a nephew of Miss Clurice, we read that Clarice Hastings on January 17,1892 to Patrick Henry Secombe and Cordelia Sinden Andrews, the second in a family of seven, with Mrs Knight as midwife.
In her time she has seen the first mail service established between Beechwood and Wauchope by Falls; the beginnings of the township of Wauchope taking over from the once thriving village of Ennis.
A new wharf was built at Ennis and there was talk of removing the punt at Ennis to the Rock's Ferry site.
It was fitting that Clarice should have been a special guest at the opening of the new bridge in 1985 as she most certainly would have been at The Rocks when the punt was finally oght round in 1910. In 1898 Clarice's grandfather Isaac Andrews sold Ruthven Hill to Mr. A. J. Bartrim for 700 pounds, it
being the centre for all
sports and recreation.
Concerts, picnics and debating meetings were held. Most people travelled the river by boat or on foot to take part.
Patrick and Cordelia Secombe, like their forebears were respected clin-
zens of the district taking part in all public ventures and doing their best to improve the growing township of Wauchope.
In the early '20's they moved to Wauchope, resiting the big Fallick house from Redbark a position near of the Hospital nom plex).

Mr. Secombe was particularly interested in gardens and orchards.
He was an instigator in trees being planted in the
streets, and the Gardening streets,
Club.

Miss Clarice has won trophies for her home garden. People laughed when he offered a prize way back in 1920 for a town garde but the project took off and was sponsored by the Show Committee while Mr Secombe was a member His house and garden was always a picture and many young boys and girls learned to love the land through a Rural Youth gudance a Miss Clarice went to the school in Cameron Street coming across th river by boat.

As a young woman she took over the care of the home, her sister Adelle being a popular music teach er, and like the Josiah Secombes, she pruvided accomodation for many a young schoolteacher, some of whom became lifelong friends.
It is anticipated many relatives and friends will be offering their congratula tions to this lovely lady on her special day.
