MR. JAMES CAMPBELL

THERE passed away at "Lilybank," Wauchope, at the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. S. R. Andrews, on Saturday last an old and respected resident of the district in the person of Mr. James Campbell, an early settler in the Hastings district. The late Mr. Campbell was born on the Patterson River 80 years ago, and came to reside on the Manning River with his parents as a boy. He was married at "Letterewe," Wauchope, when 30 years of age, to Miss Annabella Bain, daughter of the late Mr. A. Bain, of Wauchope. Of the marriage there were ten children, six boys and four girls, eight of whom survive, viz., Messrs. A. B. Campbell and W. Campbell (Wauchope), John James (Manly), Neil (Sydney), Duncan Bain (Hillston), Lauchlan (Koree Island), and Mesdames S. R. Andrews (Wauchope), and J. Ringland (Port Macquarie). Deceased, who was a man of retiring disposition, was for many years following farming pursuits at Koree Island, but before retiring was for a long period engaged in the dairying industry at King Creek. He took no keen interest in public affairs, being content to live more for and with his family.

The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon, the remains being interred in the Presbyterian section of the Cross Roads Cemetery in the presence of a large number of relatives and friends. The Rev. M. C. Ramsay, M.A., of the Free Presbyterian Church (Wauchope), assisted by the Rev. J. Davies (Presbyterian), performed the last sad rites.

SAT. MR. LACHLAN CAMPBELL

A Hastings native, held in the highest esteem by all who knew him, crossed to the Great Beyond on Wednesday of last week, in the person of Mr. Lachlan Campbell, of Koree Island, where he was born 56 years ago.

The late Mr. Campbell spent the whole of his life in this district, and was esteemed by all for his upright manly bearing and his intense honesty of purpose in all matters. He devoted his attention mainly to his family and his home interests, but was an Elder of the Free Presbyterian Church for many years, and, in his younger days, played football, and was proud to be one of the team to gain premiership honours for Wauchope in years gone by.

The late Mr. Campbell's health had been failing for some time, and his end came at the Hastings District Hospital, where he had been a patient for three weeks, on Wednesday of last week.

Deceased married Miss Maude Sonter, and there were three daughters of the union, who, with their mother, survive, viz., Mrs. H. Blythe (Koree Island), Mrs. M. Tout (Brombin) and Mrs. Albert Hollis (Long Flat).

Surviving brothers and sisters are: Messrs. Duncan Campbell (Wauchope), William (Alstonville), Jack (Sydney), Mesdames J. Ringland and S. R. Andrews, both of Wauchope.

The interment took place at the Crossroads Cemetery on Friday afternoon, after a service at the Free Presbyterian Church, conducted by Rev. J. A. Harman, assisted by Rev. John Walker, many friends attending to pay a final tribute. — Shire "Gazette"

MR. A. B. CAMPBELL.

After an illness really extending over a period of years Mr. Alexander Bain Campbell passed away at his residence, "Carrington," near Wauchope, on Monday morning last. The late Mr. Campbell was 57 years of age, and was born at Dingo Creek, on the Manning River, being a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. Campbell, who resided at King Creek for many years. When fairly young the deceased came to the Hastings River with his parents, who settled at Korae Island and later at King Creek. Mr. Campbell was educated on this river, and lived here all of his life, with the exception of two years, spent in New Zealand, when quite a young man. Like his parents he followed farming pursuits for many years. He was married here to Miss Grace Andrews, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. S. Andrews.

About 1908, with Mr. W. Bain, the deceased assisted in establishing the "Hastings Shire Gazette" at Wauchope, and has been associated with the paper almost continually ever since, and for some years as sole proprietor and editor.

Until some ten years or more ago the late Mr. Campbell was a big, robust man, apparently in the prime of life, but since that time he has gradually failed, until called to rest on Monday last as stated. He suffered with a very persistent ailment in diabetes, and last year had a few weeks respite and care in the H. D. Hospital. He was most appreciative of the treatment accorded whilst there, and has since, through his paper, been a keen advocate for help to the institution so that it may be enabled to continue its good work in the cause of suffering humanity.

During his life Mr. Campbell was associated with all public bodies in the town, and was ever ready to assist all movements for the benefit of his own town and the Hastings District generally. He not only assisted personally, but, also, through his paper, and did not always meet with the encouragement and support his efforts warranted.

He was fond of all manly sport, and was an upright and just man, his word being his bond. He was a regular attendant at Church, being an adherent of the Free Kirk. He was also a member of the L.O.L.

Deceased bore his illness without complaint and with Christian fortitude, and his passing will be regretted by a wide circle of friends and relatives.

The remains were laid to rest in the Presbyterian portion of the Crossroads Cemetery on Tuesday, the funeral cortege moving from his late residence at 1 o'clock. A large assemblage had gathered to pay their last respects. The service was conducted by the Rev. M. C. Ramsay. The members of the L.O.L. were present in regalia, and at the conclusion of the Church service performed the final ceremony of their lodge, whilst the members clasped hands round the grave. This ceremony was carried out by the Rev. M. C. Ramsay and Mr. G. J. Smith. At the conclusion, the members sang, "O God Our Help in Ages Past."

The Rev. Ramsay made feeling reference at the graveside to the many sterling qualities of the deceased, and to his good works in the life of the community, his steadfastness and faith.

The funeral arrangements were carried out by Mr. L. J. Figgott.

We extend our sympathy to the bereaved widow and family of three sons and one daughter, viz. Messrs. Sam, Colin and Lex. Campbell, and Miss A. Campbell.

CAMPBELL REUNION

The 125 descendants of James and Rosena Campbell came from four States to attend a family re-union at Rollands Plains on Sunday.

James Campbell (one of a family of 10) was a son of William and Ann Jane Campbell, who came to the Wilson River

area in 1868, and eventually left a property he had named "Lambfield" to son James.

So the delightful rural scene surrounding the Rollands Plains hall was the perfect and obvious choice for the reunion venue. A delightful day favored the function.

Mrs. Elsie Argue (a cousin Campbell) assisted Mr. Keith Campbell, a grandson of James, both Port Macquarie residents, in arranging the re-union.

Descendants of James' son George, predominated at Sunday's assembly.

They numbered 65; Ernest was represented by 13, Joseph 7, Eva (Mrs. Edwin Secomb) 15, Rosie (Mrs. Robert Cochrane) 8, James 4, Robert 3, whilst 10 guests of the gathering were descendants of James and Rosena's brothers and sisters.

Twenty-two of those assembled—from NSW, South Australia, Victoria and Queensland—were grandchildren of James and Rosena, 14 were husbands and wives, 46 were great grandchildren, and 33 were great great grandchildren, all of James and Rosena.

In the main the Campbells stuck with the land, and first and second generations grew up in rural areas: George, farming, Upper Macleay and Inverell; Ernest, farming, Wilson River and Inverell; Joseph, farming, Wilson River and Port Macquarie; Eva, farming, Upper Macleay and The Entrance; Rosie, farming, Bega; James, auctioneer and farming, Kempsey, Glen Innes, Toowoomba, Lismore; Robert, farming, Wilson River and Glen Innes.

Rosie's husband, Mr. Robert Cochrane, is well known for his association with the Royal Show as a judge of Jersey cattle.

Wing Commander Ron Tayles, of 10 Squadron, came over from Edinburgh Airfield at Salisbury, South Australia, and brought his eldest daughter with him.

A HAPPY OCCASION

He had a pleasant visit with Group Captain (Ret.) Keith Campbell, of Port Macquarie, also of 10 Squadron, particularly in relation to Keith's term in England with the squadron during World War II.

As well as a good deal of sight-seeing, the visitors thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Rollands Plains; the church service conducted at 12 noon by the Revd. Harry Olsen, of the Presbyterian Manse in Port Macquarie, and the picnic lunch which followed.

In retrospect

The History. William Campbell (1815-1880) married Ann Jane Quirk (1814-1902) on the Isle of Man on 23rd September, 1837. William, the son of James and Sarah Campbell, was born in County Down, Northern Ireland.

Ann Jane, the daughter of William and Catherine Quirk, was born on the Isle of Man. Both James Campbell and William Quirk were farmers. Ann Jane's parents lived at Lambfell Moar Kirk Jerman, Isle of Man, and there seems little doubt that this was the origin for naming the property "Lambfield" purchased by William at Rollands Plains.

William and Ann migrated to Australia with their first child William during 1839 in the vessel "Hero of Malown" of 482 tons out of Liverpool with 211 emigrants and passengers. During the voyage the son William died.

After arrival in Australia William and Ann Jane went to a farming property at Fosterton near Dungog and reared a family of 10 children of whom James Campbell was the 5th, born at Dungog on 23rd May, 1846.

During 1868 William and Ann Jane came to the Wilson River and on 9th April, 1868 he bought a property of 1110 acres which he called "Lambfield". This property was farmed by his son James Campbell and upon his father's death on 4th August, 1880, it was left to him under the terms of his father's Will. Ann Jane died on 10th November, 1902.

Rosena Halliday was born at Rollands Plains on 31st May, 1846, the daughter (6th child of a family of 13) of George Halliday and his wife Rosanna. George Halliday was a miller (described in his obituary as "a fine old English gentleman").

James Campbell and Rosena Halliday were married at Rollands Plains on 22nd March, 1871. They had 9 children, George, Ernest, Joseph, Annie, Rosie and Eva (twins) James, Ellie and Robert. The family moved from Rollands Plains to the Upper Macleay about 1887 and farmed the property known as Parrabel. James Campbell died on 15th July, 1923 and his wife Rosena on 27th July, 1929.
