

# You Beaut winner

STAFF at a Wauchope manufacturing company will toast success with a \$1000 party after their input led to award-winning recognition on Thursday.

Beaut Press, a subsidiary of Bennetts Steel, scooped the Key Business Innovation award at the launch of the Mid-North Coast Innovation Festival.

As well as the prestige that accompanies the award, there was a cheque for \$1000 which will be spent on celebrations.

Working owner Peta Simmons attributed the award to her employees, and paid tribute to the efforts of manager Tony Kundicevic and workshop manager Peter Galbraith.

Their contribution, and that of their colleagues, led to the development of the Beaut Press machine, used in timber truss pressing for roofs.

"The machine is not entirely new, there are similar ones out there," Mrs Simmons said.

"What we've done is redesign it and improve the manufacturing process so that it is more efficient and improves productivity."

Mrs Simmons said the factory's location made it ideally situated to operate between Queensland and Victoria and there was scope to sell the press overseas.

"It's good news for the local economy," she explained. "We've been able to take on five employees and three apprentices and 85 per cent of the materials for the machine have been sourced in the Hastings area."

Mrs Simmons said there was the potential to employ up to another 12 staff.

A panel of four judges faced the task of choosing a winner from six entrants, all of which are on the Key Business Development Program.

The other finalists were Hastings Valley Olives and

Yarras Olive Products, Wiggly Tail Pork Shop and Butchery, Timbertown Pies, Bago Woodworks and Moisture Cure.

Port Macquarie-Hastings Council economic development manager Trevor Sargeant paid tribute to each company's innovative qualities and outlined the

reasons for the panel's first choice pick.

"The nomination from Beaut Press, is the highest form of innovation as it is adding an entirely new attribute to the business," he said.

"The award is richly deserved."

# Feeding the world beef

A WAUCHOPE delegation will serve up locally prepared beef at a food and beverage showcase being held in Hong Kong this week.

Hokubee Australia, renowned for its "Meltique" beef, is among of a 25-strong contingent of NSW producers taking part in HOFEX 2009, a major international trade event.

The company was recently invited to attend a trade show in Shanghai, at which it met representatives of the federal export agency AusTrade.

In the wake of that, Hokubee Australia received an invitation from the NSW Government to be part of its delegation.

Plant manager Jody Perkins has gone

to Hong Kong for the expo and will be joined by his managing director Takatoshi Miyamoto, the sales manager and representatives from the Hokubee parent company.

Administration manager Belinda Perkins said the company would give cooking demonstrations of Meltique beef and provide information at its stand.

"We have an innovative product, a product for the future," Mrs Perkins said.

"This will help our push into the Asian market, where we have already established a foothold in Singapore, Taiwan, Korea and Japan."

Hokubee sells its produce at markets in the Hastings and Sydney, and the company is keen to develop its domestic profile.

A potential move into supplying supermarkets also is mooted.

The Wauchope plant purchases grass-fed beef and injects it with beef tallow to produce a marbling of fat that retains the meat's juices and keeps it tender like grain-fed beef, Mrs Perkins explained.

Its 45-strong workforce also produces halal beef, which has attracted interest from Indonesia and the Middle East.

"Australia is seen as clean and green in the eyes of much of the world," Mrs Perkins said.

"We are seen to produce good beef."

It was this reputation and the absence of bovine diseases found in other beef-producing markets that persuaded the Japanese company to invest in the setting up of the Wauchope plant, she said.

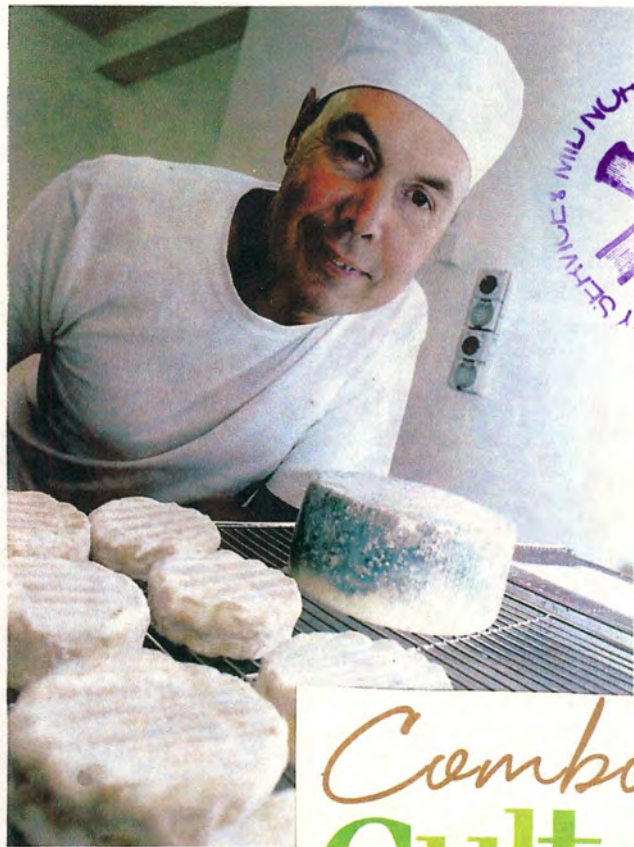

# Comboyne Culture

An even greater variety of locally made cheeses are tantalising the tastebuds of residents throughout the Hastings, following the establishment of boutique regional manufacturer, Comboyne Culture – which boasts the slogan, “Cheese with Altitude”. Comboyne Culture products have been on the market for more than a year now and the company is enjoying great success. We catch up with head cheesemaker, Ron Lindsay, who runs the business with his wife, Sandy.

**Given that you didn't have any background in cheese making, what made you decide to establish Comboyne Culture?**

We bought the old Comboyne Cheese Factory in 2004 with a plan to open a café/gallery. But after we purchased the building, we were approached by a businessman interested in leasing the building off us to make cheese again.

He then promptly disappeared, but a seed had been sown in us and started us thinking that a small cheese factory would be a good drawcard for the café gallery.

**> There is obviously a lot of skill and technique which goes into making cheese. How did you transform yourself into a cheese-maker?**

At the end of 2004 I did a beginners cheese course at Wingham (Duck Under the Table). The course was run by Carol Willman over two days and it was an excellent whey (a small cheese joke) to get started in cheese making.

It was at this course that I met Neil Willman, Carol's husband, who had come along for the weekend to assist Carol with the course. Neil is arguably the foremost cheese educator in Australia and is an international cheese judge.

After meeting Neil I then decided to do an intensive cheese course with him in early 2005, which was held at Witches Chase Cheesery at Mt Tamborine QLD (a small factory about the size we wanted to run).

It was at this course I decided to make soft, ripened cheeses, because we could see that the quick turnover of these cheese types would make starting a cheese factory

possible with our limited funds. I then did another course with Neil in mid 2006 in Adelaide, to learn how to make blue cheeses. This was just before we started selling our first cheeses.

I am now thinking about doing a Swiss cheese making course, to give us another line of cheese to sell.

**> We have just sampled some of your Camembert, which is well presented in a gold wrapper with your bright green, black and white Comboyne Culture label. It's certainly a lovely, creamy and richly flavoured Camembert ...**

Yes, we are making a traditional Camembert much more like the cheeses you might encounter in France than the run of the mill cheeses you are likely to find in a supermarket.

**> Tell us about the other cheeses you are producing.**

We also make a Washed Rind cheese, which is made like a Camembert, then washed in other cheese ripening cultures several times; which consequently gives

these cheeses an amazing, earthy flavour. We also make two blue cheeses; a surfaced ripened cheese we call Bluembert (because of the creamy taste) and a blue vein cheese, we call Lindsay Blue.

It is possible that the blue cheeses will become the major part of our production going on the sales of these cheeses to date, and as I said earlier, we may branch into the production of Swiss cheese.

**> What does a typical week involve for you?**

At present I make cheese on one day per week and I use 500 litres of milk to produce

about 80 kilos of cheese. I do all the my own at the moment, but could probably double production on that day with a helper. The rest of my week at the factory is taken up with turning cheese, washing the washed rinds, wrapping cheese, keeping accurate records for the Safe Food Authority, cleaning the factory (cheese making is 90% cleaning and 10% cheese making) and doing deliveries and weekend markets (such as the Hastings Farmers' Market).

**> Where do you supply your products and how have sales been going?**

The business has been quite successful, with good local sales through shops and Hastings and Wingham Farmers' Markets, right from the start of production. People really do like to support local products. Sales in Sydney and Newcastle have really started to grow lately, mainly because of our exposure at the Farmers' Markets in Sydney and Newcastle.

People seem to like being able to purchase quality, handmade products straight from the producers.

**> What are your future plans for Comboyne Culture?**

For the future, we will be opening the cheese factory to the public. We have started the renovations necessary to open the facility and will be installing a viewing window into the factory, so people can watch me making cheese. They will also be able to taste all of our cheese range.

We are also making a start on the gardens around the factory. The factory is situated on two acres fronting the Thone River in beautiful Comboyne, and we would like people to be able to come to the factory, stroll through the gardens or sit and watch the river gurgling by and enjoy some cheese.

**> Good luck with your future plans and thank you for your time Ron. We look forward to sampling more of your cheeses.**
